

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

The Rapid Alert System enables the rapid exchange of information (RAPEX) between **31 European countries** and the European Commission on non- food dangerous products found on the market posing a risk to health and safety of consumers.


A weekly overview of the alerts on those products is published in English for free on <http://ec.europa.eu/rapex>. Fast Track recalls are initiated by firms who commit to work with CPSC to quickly announce the recall and remedy to protect consumers.
