





If a child puts the projectile in the mouth in order to wet it before shooting, the suction cup can detach leaving the airways obstructed by it. The bottom edge of the solid yellow plastic part of the toy gun is uneven and with sharpness and can cause injuries. / The product does not comply with the Toys Safety Directive and with the relevant European standard EN 71-1.	Recall of the product from end users

A12/01158/20	Hungary	Balloons (Country of Origin: China)		Choking Small parts (both the mouthpiece and the balls) are easily accessible and could be swallowed or inhaled by children. This could cause choking. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European standard EN 71-1.	Recall of the product from end users, Withdrawal of the product from the market
A12/01181/20	Czechia	Wooden swing seat (Country of Origin: China)		Injuries The adjusting buckle can move unexpectedly, causing the swing seat to move from its horizontal position. This can lead to the child falling from the swing. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European standard EN 71-8.	Withdrawal of the product from the market
A12/01182/20	Latvia	Toy putty (Country of Origin: China)		Choking, Injuries The product contains a magnet which is a small part and has a high magnetic flux. A small child could put the magnet in the mouth and choke on it. If a child swallows the small magnet and other metallic objects, they could attract one another causing intestinal blockage or perforation. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European standard EN 71-1.	Destruction of the product
A12/01183/20	Lithuania	Plastic toy (Country of Origin: China)		Choking, Suffocation Small parts can easily be detached (wheels, wings and parts of the tail) from the toy and it can break, generating small parts. A small child may put them in the mouth and choke on them. Moreover, the plastic of the packaging is too thin. If a child plays with the packaging, the plastic can cover the mouth and nose, causing the child to suffocate. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European Standard EN 71-1.	Withdrawal of the product from the market

A12/01184/20	Poland	Toy slime kit (Country of Origin: China)		Chemical The migration of boron from the toy is too high (measured value: 404.65 mg/kg). Ingestion or contact with an excessive quantity of boron may harm the health of children by damaging their reproductive system. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European standard EN 71-3.	Withdrawal of the product from the market
A12/01185/20	Lithuania	Plastic toy (Country of Origin: China)		Choking Small parts can easily be detached (the torso, tail and tongue) from the toy and it can break, generating small parts. Withdrawal of the product from the market
A12/01186/20	Lithuania	Plastic toy (Country of Origin: China)		Choking Small parts can easily be detached (the bangs of the forehead) from the toy and it can break, generating small parts. A small child may put them in the mouth and choke on it. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European standard EN 71-1.	Withdrawal of the product from the market
A12/01188/20	Finland	Teether (Country of Origin: China)		Choking Small parts can easily be detached or bitten off the teether. A child may consequently choke on them. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European standard EN 71-1.	Ban on the marketing of the product and any accompanying measures
A12/01189/20	Finland	Hand puppet (Country of Origin: China)		Choking Small parts (pink bobble balls) can be easily detached. A child could put them in the mouth and choke on them. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and with the relevant European standard EN 71-1.	Import rejected at border

A12/01190/20	United Kingdom	Soft toy (Country of Origin: China)		Suffocation The plastic of the packaging is too thin. If a child plays with the packaging, the plastic can cover the mouth and nose, causing the child to suffocate. / The product does not comply with the requirements of the Toy Safety Directive and the relevant European standard EN 71-1.	Destruction of the product

A weekly overview of the alerts on those products is published in English for free on <http://ec.europa.eu/rapex>. The measures taken in the notifying country in order to restrict their marketing or use can be ordered by national authorities ("compulsory measures") or be taken directly by producers and distributors ("voluntary measures").

Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled helmets and return to the store where sold or contact Active Brands/Sweet Protection for a full refund.

CPSC

The United States Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) is an independent agency of the United States government. To provide better service in alerting the American people to unsafe, hazardous or defective products, a "one stop shop" for U.S. Government recalls, www.recalls.gov, has been created. Publics can report unsafe products to CPSC by using the platform.

The recall list is divided into seven categories: Consumer Products, Motor Vehicles, Boats, Food, Medicine, Cosmetics and Environmental Products. Generally, the recall was conducted, voluntarily by the company, under CPSC's Fast Track Recall program. Fast Track recalls are initiated by firms who commit to work with CPSC to quickly announce the recall and remedy to protect consumers.

Australian Product Safety System

The Australian product safety system is to maximize the safety of good by the cooperation of consumers, businesses and agencies. This policy sets out the principles adopted by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) for prioritizing and addressing product safety risks.

Under the Australian Consumer Law, a responsible Minister can order a compulsory recall when there are hazards on the products. A voluntary recall could be conducted to remove the product from the marketplace when the suppliers become aware of unsafe or defective products.

The ACCC administers a national recalls system for recalls of specific and general consumer products, and publishes all product recalls on the website <https://www.productsafety.gov.au/recalls>.
